1. Does the cover give you any clues about the story?
2. Who is the main character?
3. What is his main problem?
4. Tell how Little Roo tries to fix his problem.
5. Is he successful?
6. Alliteration is repeating the first letter of a word in several nearby words. Can you spot the alliteration on pages 4-5? (stretch, startle, swish). Can you find more alliteration later in the book?
7. What does Little Roo mean when he says, “Maybe I need to hit the hay a little earlier?”
8. Authors use different techniques to make you want to turn the page to see what happens next. Can you find examples of these?
 - Ellipsis (. . .)
 - Using words like *then, if, when, because, except*
 - Asking a question
 - Pictures or words that make us wonder what happens next
9. Do you have a favorite illustration? How do the pictures help to tell the story?
10. How does the Bible verse at the beginning of the book fit in with Little Roo’s story?
11. Are there things you are really good at?
